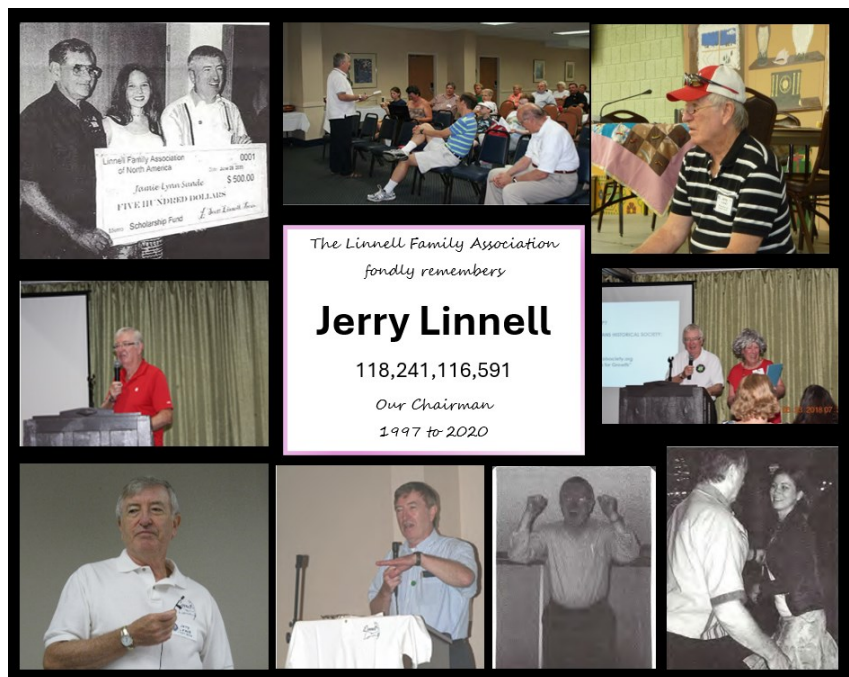

Jerry D. Linnell, Sr., Former LFA Chairman, Obituary

Jerald (Jerry, Gerald) D. Linnell, Sr., (82) beloved father of 4 and grandfather of 9, bonus father of 3, grandfather of 7, and a longtime resident of Maryland and Washington, D.C., passed away peacefully at home with his wife, Jane, by his side on July 20, 2024, from complications due to Parkinson's.

Growing up in Grand Marais, MN, Jerry often said he could not imagine anyone ever having a better childhood. He played football and basketball in high school, which led him to coaching these sports for many years in Maryland and D.C. He was an avid Washington Redskins/Commanders and Nationals fan, and loved to discuss all sports and topics of the day with anyone – everyone was a friend to him!

Jerry graduated from Grand Marais High School (1960) in Cook County and the Minnesota School of Business (1963) in Minneapolis, obtaining his court reporting degree before venturing east to Washington, D.C. to work for Ward & Paul and later Salomon Brothers in Baltimore, Maryland. In 1982 he began his 32-year career with the U.S. Senate, transcribing the daily activities on the Senate floor. In 1999, he was promoted to be Chief of the Official Reporters of Debates. After 50 years in the court reporting field, Jerry retired in 2014.

He learned at an early age to play the accordion from his father and loved to play it whenever he had the chance, especially at the extended family music festival gatherings at Bonnie Featherstone's cabin on Pike Lake. He returned to Grand Marais on a regular basis throughout most of his life and loved seeing old friends and camping with his family in the BWCA.

He was a loving, trusting, generous and supportive man who enjoyed playing golf, traveling on baseball trips with Brock and the guys, Chevrolet Corvette Stingrays, and always had a lot of fun wherever he went. Jerry was very active in the Linnell Family Association (LFA) where he served as chairman for 20 years.

Jerry was preceded in death by his parents Verne and Dolly Linnell and sister LaVerne Sue Linnell. He is survived by his four children: Laurie Linnell Benzing (Jeff Loveless); Jerald D. Linnell, Jr (Debbie); Heather Spina (Brian); and Katie Breiner (Matt); plus 9 grandchildren: Colleen, Rachel, Leanne, Monica, JT (Jerald III), Oliver, Henry, Penny and Jack.; his ex-wife and children's mother, Patricia; his beloved wife, Jane, who took such good care of him these last few years; and Jane's children and grandchildren who he treated as his own. Jerry will be missed by all who knew him.

This is part five of our historian Jason Jon Quick's history of Robert Linnell. So far we have seen the connection of Robert to the Howse family and to John Lothrop. To avoid or get out of prison, Robert agreed to emigrate to America. This section of the paper turns our attention more fully to Robert and his family here in America.

THE LIFE OF ROBERT LINNELL - PART 5



Nothing is really known about Robert Linnell's ancestry. Linnell is a rare name concentrated in North-West Northamptonshire with a family history going back to the 12th century. It would be safe to assume Robert was born about 1596-1603 due to the fact he had probably just finished a BA in divinity in 1623. Robert could have received his master's degree in London because he assumed the moniker of "Mr." in a few documents in Plymouth Colony. It's assumed Robert was a wealthy gentleman and clergy were normally the younger sons of wealthy families. It has been assumed Robert was born in 1584 because he was mistaken for the father of Sarah Learned, born about 1607 who married, first Thomas Ewer and secondly Thomas Lothrop. Thomas was Robert's nephew from his second marriage to Pennina Howes. In Rachel Wynn's book, it was implied Robert knew Kent, England but there is no evidence to support that. Robert was living in London in 1623 and the Lothrop's and Howse families moved to London from Kent before Robert married Pennina. John Lothrop's son Benjamin was baptized Sept 24th, 1626, while Robert was living in London.

The Linnell or Linnell surname in the correlation of being connected to the publishers and stationers cannot be overlooked. In London in about 1533, a certain John Lynnett was paid 32d for printing a "book" for the church of St Andrew Hubbard. In the Transcripts of the Company of Stationers, Richarde Linnell a free journeyman printer is recorded having three apprentices from 1561 to 1566, all from Northamptonshire. (1) Thomas Breade son of John of Hulcote, Northamptonshire. (2) Tymothe Ryder son of John of Weedon Bec, Northamptonshire. (3) Henry Sharpe son of Rycharde of Towcester, Northamptonshire. Richard might have had a son or grandson named Thomas that is Listed as a stationer in 1633. A Thomas Linnell of London became a freeman Stationer in London and apprenticed a John Rawlins In 1533. Henry Sharpe whom apprenticed to Rycharde Linnell until 1570 was part of the Martin Marprelate scandal involving the printing of heretical protestant tracts. Humphrey Newman a Cobbler in London was distributing the tracts while Henry Sharpe was the bookbinder. A few people were executed because of these tracts and involved a minor Noble gentleman named Job Throckmorton from Hasely, Warwickshire and Sir Richard Knightly of Norton, Northamptonshire who also owned the lands in Snoscombe. It is the Author's opinion that Robert comes from one of the Linnell families of Northamptonshire which could hopefully be proven by Y-DNA analysis.

Robert and Pennina likely boarded the ship "*Castle*" owned by William and Thomas Hatch of Scituate, Plymouth Colony in April of 1638 when it was docked in London on the River Thames. (The brothers were originally from Wye, Kent, England) The ship arrived in Boston in July of 1638 and carried the family of Thomas Hatch who were on their way to Scituate and to join his brother, William's family. No other Ships are recorded sailing from London to Boston in that year after this date. In John Lothrop's journal, is written "*My Brother Robert Linnell and his wife having a letter of dismissal from the church in London joyned to us Setemb. 16, 1638.*" Robert was granted land in Sepiecan outside of Scituate (now Rochester) Dec of 1638, but the grant was rejected because his congregation decided to move to Barnstable.



Robert Linnell born 1596-1603 in England died sometime after 23 January 1662, in Barnstable, Plymouth Colony and his first wife Susan born about 1600 died before 1633 in London, England had:

1. Susan born about December 1623 Eastcheape, London, England; died unknown probably London, England
2. David born about 1627 London, England; died 14 November 1688, Barnstable, Plymouth Colony

3. Hannah born about 1619 London, England; died after 1673 Barnstable, Plymouth Colony
4. Mary born about 1631 London, England; died after 1653 Barnstable, Plymouth Colony
5. Abigail born about 1666 London, England; died after 1663 Barnstable, Plymouth Colony

Robert remarried before 1633, Penninah Howse in London, England. They had;

1. Shubael born about 1634 London, England; died after 1665 Barnstable, Plymouth Colony
2. Bethia born 7 February 1640 Barnstable, Plymouth Colony; died 26 March 1726 Harwich, Barnstable, Massachusetts Colony.

Early Plymouth Colony, Scituate & Barnstable Records describe the early life of the Linnell family

Sept 16th 1638 *“My Brother Robert Linnell and his wife having a letter of dismission from the church in London joyned to us Setemb. 16, 1638”*



Jan 22nd 1639 *“A grant of a plantacon called Seppekann, and the land thereout, for the seatinge of a township for a congregation there is made vnto...Robte Linnell, as commitees to dispose of such lands lying there about as shalbe limitted and bounded vnto them, reserueing a pcell of 300 or 400 acres for a farme, or to be disposed of as the government here shall thinke meete.”*

Feb 1st 1639 *“Inhabitants of Scituate, took the oath of allegiance to the King, and fidelite to the colony.”... “Robte Linnell”*

June 4th 1639 *“Robt Linnell”* is sworn as a constable in Plymouth Colony in front of Governor Bradford. Freeman of Barnstable *“Mr Robte Linnett”* 22 men 5 have the moniker *“Mr”*



Dec 3rd 1639 At General Court before Gov. William Bradford *“Robert Linnett, .. admitted freeman this Court, & Sworn accordingly”*

Oct 11th 1639 *“when Mr Lothrop and members of his church in Scituate removed hither “to Barnstable at a place called “Mattacheese” by the Indians”*



March 3rd 1640 - That Thomas Lumbert was *“allowed to keep victualing, or an ordinary, for the entertainment of strangers, and to draw w(l)ines in Barnstable”* in 1639, indicates progress. The first town-meeting of which mention is made, was had in relation to the division of lands. An order was made *“that no inhabitant within this plantation shall make sale of his house or any of his lands until he has offered the same to the proprietors; and in case the plantation buy it not, then he shall provide a purchaser whom the town shall approve; and, if the town do not provide a chapman in two months, he may then sell it to whom he will. List of Townsfolk ... Robert Linnett”*
